

What makes a question *better*?

Improve your listening

Great questions come from great listening.

Build on what the client is saying.



Don't impersonate Socrates

Ask genuine questions, not q's designed to help the client see something you already see.

Put your list away.



Ask wider questions to help the client expand his/her perspective.

Ask narrower questions to help the client drill down to specifics and find focus.

Use spice sparingly.

When things are flowing, your questions are merely facilitating the client's progress.

When the client is stuck or going in circles, use creative, out of the blue questions to help add some energy.
